Elevating Mentoring Possibilities for Overcoming and Withstanding Educational Roadblocks in Sickle Cell Disease.

Mentorship program for youth with Sickle Cell Disease!



EMPOWER SCD is a research study at Emory University and Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, studying the impact of a near-peer mentorship program on middle and high school students with Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) on their interest in STEMM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, and Medicine).

If you join this research study and mentorship program we will match you (middle and high school student) with a Near-Peer Mentor (University/College STEMM) students). We think that this mentorship program will help increase your interest in STEMM and show you how to have a career in a STEMM field as a researcher, health care provider, or engineer.

After being accepted into the program, you will be matched (gender) with a Near-Peer Mentor (college or graduate school student) during the 2025-2026 school year, you will participate in:

- ❖ 1 week (5-days) in-person Summer Camp (July)
- ❖ 3 in-person All-Hands meetings (October, January, and March − Cohort Celebration) − up to 4 hours/day.
- 9 monthly online Mentee Cohort meetings up to 1 hour/meeting
- ❖ 36 weekly online Mentee/Near-Peer Mentor team meetings at least 30 minutes/meeting, record in a Communication Journal what was talked about at the meeting and goals for the next week.
- Before and After surveys
- Program end group interview asking about your experience with the program and your interest in STEMM.
- Optional/as-needed online Discussion board posts
- ❖ Optional share your school grades (report cards) before joining the program, halfway through the year, and at the end of the program.

For your participation, we will provide you with \$300 for 9 months of weekly meetings, \$200 for transportation, and a stipend of \$400 for attending summer camp (\$10 per hour x 40 hours).
